  - i. Budget breakdown and vote voted on and approved!
  - ii. The total GSS budget is \$12,430. This is \$3000 less than last year resulting in less allocation to the committees compared to last year.
    - .15 allocated to the executive council and .85 goes to the committees.
  - iii. We have two accounts. We can spend some of the \$24,972 in the reserved fund.
    - The reserved fund can be used, but we would like to save *some* for the upcoming cohort.
    - The allocations can be changed later. Later changes to the allocations will require a vote.
  - iv. The committees have used the budgets for renting venues, food, and/or printing, etc. Last year, the GSS used up all the budget.
  - v. The university must approve events four weeks prior to their scheduled dates. Food must be paid by the Pcard, and tax has to be exempt.

  - ii. Thesis-dissertation Travel funds
    - Applicants are eligible to apply once at the thesis-dissertation stage.
    - 3 out of 5 were eligible and approved. \$2500 in total was granted.
  - iii. Presentation funds
    - Applicants can apply once per fiscal year.
    - The committee is currently accepting Cycle 2. The cycle will end on December 2.
    - The fund will be determined depending on the distance (up to \$1000).

- Among 41 applications, 33 applications were eligible. 23 of these applications received approval, totaling \$16,292 in value.
- The programs/departments were diverse. The committee strives to continue it.
- \$18,792 in total across the two existing funds was granted. 22% of the budget has been spent looks good!
